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Seasonal depression:

What is it and what can you do?

Every year as the seasons change, about five percent of Americans will face the struggles of seasonal depression, otherwise known as seasonal affective disorder.

As the days are shorter and the weather gets colder, Americans feel more sad than usual. It is believed that part of the cause is the lack of sunlight as the days grow shorter. This lack of sunlight can stop a part of the brain, the hypothalamus, from working properly. This can cause the production of melatonin in the body to increase, making you much more sleepy. This change in the brain is also linked to the lower production of serotonin, creating feelings of depression.

The two main types of seasonal depression are winter-pattern and summerpattern. Both are affected by the night-day cycles of the year, but are quite opposite of each other. The winter-pattern is typically due to the lack of sunlight and vitamin D, while the summer-pattern is affected by shorter and hotter nights, which disrupt sleeping patterns. If you are experiencing seasonal depression, it is likely that you will also feel quite irritable, have feelings of guilt and hopelessness, poor appetite or have trouble concentrating.

Negative thoughts and feelings about the holiday season are also linked to the cause of seasonal depression. Stressing over the holidays is well known for its contribution to the consistent low mood that some may experience this time of year. While it is unclear if these negative thoughts are the cause or effect of this mood disorder, they provide a good starting point when looking for treatment.

When treating seasonal depression, there are four main categories of treatment options; light therapy, psychotherapy, antidepressant medication and vitamin D. Light therapy and vitamin D are typically used to treat winter-pattern depression, while medication and psychotherapy are used to treat depression in general. There are no summer-pattern specific treatment options.

It is important that we know and understand the reality of depression and know what to do in real life situations. Know the signs and symptoms and don't hesitate to seek help. Opinion: 13-0 and no play off?

Junior Sports Reporter Every year D1 colleges and universities across the country compete for a chance to make it to the college football playoffs. Out of all those schools, only four teams actually make it it. This year, the Florida State University Semionals went 13-0 and were Atlantic Coast Conference champions but didn't make the playoffs because of one play that injured their starting quarterback.

The FSU Seminoles lost their starting quarterback Jordan Travis in a game against North Alabama on Nov. 18 2023 in which the Semionals won 58-13. Travis would sadly break his leg on a rushing attempt when the defender would cleanly bring him down but land on his leg. Many people presumed that FSU would still make the playoffs because of their dominance on the season and show they could win games without their star quarterback. FSU had the 14th ranked defense in the nation as well as the 45th ranked offense. Jordan Travis contributed with 2,756 pass yards, 20 touchdown passes to 2 interceptions, a 63.9% completion rate, and 154.5 passer ratingaccording to the official NCAA website.

A committee of members--retired players, coaches, athletic directors and administrators--determines who gets in and who doesn't. They meet together and pick the supposedly top 4 teams in the country. The meeting and seeding for the playoffs happened on December 3rd, 2023. The final 4 consist of #1 Michigan, #2 Washington, #3 Texas and the surpriser #4 Alabama.

In years past, Alabama has been a clear favorite to make the playoffs, but this year the Crimson Tide finished with a 12-1 record and snuck in with the 4th seed. Alabama's record is up there with Michigan's 13-0, Washington's 13-0, and Texas's 12-1 records. Yes, Alabama still had an amazing season but sent off their quarterback from last season Bryce Young to the NFL. The Tide also lost to Texas on Sep. 9 2023.

When Sunday, Dec. 3 came around and FSU was not a part of the playoffs, media outlets all over the country tweeted and other former players in the NFL and some other sport stars took to social media to spread their frustration with the committee's decision. Jalen Ramsey, a former cornerback for the Semionals and now cornerback on the NFL Miami Dolphins had this to say about FSU being left out: "If you don't want to put an FSU team who earned it in because of an injury, it's [bogus]." A sense of favoritism for the Southeastern Conference is believed to be the reason why FSU was left out.

Many people, including myself, speculate that FSU didn't make the CFP playoffs because of what happened last year with TCU. TCU went 13-2 and got the 3rd seed in the 2022 CFP, inturn facing the Michigan Wolverines the 2nd seed in the Fiesta Bowl. TCU beat Michigan 51-45 in the semifinal game and moved on to the National Championship against the reigning defending champs the Georgia Bulldogs.

TCU was then dominated in the National Championship game with a beating 65-7.

The CFP committee made a horrible mistake with leaving out FSU. FSU showed all season why they are a top five team in the country for college football but also showed they can win with their quarterback. FSU's defense proved it all season, holding many of



their opponents to under thirty points in games. If the committee didn't want another TCU, then they are limiting the players options for every aspect of the game. It is not fair that FSU didn't even get a chance to play and or prove why they are a top five team in the country.

A compromise has been made by the committee but will come into effect next year. A twelve team playoff bracket, again voted in by the committee, will bring more opportunities for teams that may not be the most dominant.

The twelve team playoff will allow teams like FSU who have a season ending injury at the end of the year or teams that went 11-2 or 10-3 a shot to compete with the other undefeated or one loss teams. I feel like the twelve team playoff is a plea deal for the fans because of the negative feedback that came with this year's four team playoff. Yes, though there will be some great chances for other teams to make the playoffs and some teams get that chance, I think an eight team playoff would be better.

The competitiveness of the four team playoff has been ecstatic over the years. If a team were to lose about two or three games then they were almost certainly out of the playoffs. With a twelve team playoff teams can lose about three to four and still make it.


